Matthew 4:18-22 (CEB)

¹⁸ As Jesus walked alongside the Galilee Sea, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew, throwing fishing nets into the sea, because they were fishermen. ¹⁹ "Come, follow me," he said, "and I'll show you how to fish for people." ²⁰ Right away, they left their nets and followed him. ²¹ Continuing on, he saw another set of brothers, James the son of Zebedee and his brother John. They were in a boat with Zebedee their father repairing their nets. Jesus called them and ²² immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him.

Romans 9:9-17 (CEB)

Be the best at showing honor to each other. ¹¹ Don't hesitate to be enthusiastic—be on fire in the Spirit as you serve the Lord! ¹² Be happy in your hope, stand your ground when you're in trouble, and devote yourselves to prayer. ¹³ Contribute to the needs of God's people, and welcome strangers into your home. ¹⁴ Bless people who harass you—bless and don't curse them. ¹⁵ Be happy with those who are happy, and cry with those who are crying. ¹⁶ Consider everyone as equal, and don't think that you're better than anyone else. Instead, associate with people who have no status. Don't think that you're so smart. ¹⁷ Don't pay back anyone for their evil actions with evil actions, but show respect for what everyone else believes is good.

We're blessed today to have Rev. Bruce Reyes-Chow preaching and sharing with us in worship. Bruce is a loca Presbyterian pastor, and was the youngest ever Moderator of the Presbyterian Church USA when he was elected in 2008. He is the author of several books including:

Call to Worship Opening Litany

Taken from John 12:12-16 and words by Nadia Bolz Weber

One: The great crowd that had come to the festival heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem.

ALL: So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, shouting, 'Hosanna!
Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord—the King of Israel!'

One: Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it; as it is written: 'Do not be afraid, daughter of Zion. Look, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!'

ALL: His disciples did not understand these things at first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written of him and had been done to him.

One: But before many of the followers of Jesus would proclaim that he is risen, they would maybe join in the shout of "Crucify him!" They would turn their back on him, disappointed, embarrassed that he wouldn't, that he couldn't, save himself. ... That he wasn't going to save them.

ALL: Like them, we too often want a God who we see as chain-breaker and freedom-giver, but we don't want one who suffers and dies, seeming to be a loser.

One: Like them, we too often think of God more as an angry loan shark demanding his pound of flesh, seeking to punish us for our sins, as opposed to a God who invites us and all of creation to sing a new song.

ALL: And so, we too come this day to remember, to be reminded, to remind each other that that the God we often want, isn't the God that is; that the hot mess of doubt and darkness we find ourselves in, is in part because we think the cross is about us and not about God.

One: We struggle to trust that God is actually good.

ALL: Hosanna! – Come Holy One!
Remind us of your heart,
Rekindle in us your love,
Reorient us to your kingdom values.
Blessed is the One who comes in the name of the Lord.
