## Reflections on Today's Readings Mark 1:1-20

The first word of the book of Mark is the same word used in Genesis 1:1 "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth." Mark seems to be saying that is a continuation, or a renewed presence, of God's creating power in our world.

The chapter goes quickly, moving from this rhyming of creation, to connections with First Testament prophetic scriptures from the Exodus, Malachi and Isaiah, on to Jesus' baptism, battle in the wilderness and his first sermon and followers. Throughout it we hear the word "immediately" or "right away" used to describe the response of people who heard and experienced Jesus. The speed of the story-telling seems reinforced by that. Even the basic proclaimed message of Jesus contains a reference to time. "Now is the time! Here comes God's kingdom! Change your hearts and lives, and trust this good news!" He's proclaiming that God is in the world in a heavily present way, so today, now, is the moment to respond, to join in by divesting of the past and choosing a new future.

Jesus overcomes the devil in what appears as a battle in the wilderness. It's there, where God seems to not be in control, where one is hunted by hunger and wild animals, that Jesus overcomes the strong man who tempts him to choose another path. Jesus returns,

crossing through the wilderness (like the Israelites in the exodus) to establish something more expansive, more inclusive, something new. But rather than starting with the elites, or those that already have power he starts with the lowly, the quotidian, the average joe-schmo: the fishermen.



#### **OUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION & EXAMEN:**

- What engaged, enraged, or surprised you in this text?
- Recognizing that God is doing something new (the good news) and joining into it involves divestment, setting the "old," "former," or familiar ways of being aside. What are some familiar things, routines, thoughts that you might need to divest yourself of in order to embrace that God's power is here and now, and you're invited to be part of the new thing God is doing?
- What invitation do you hear the Spirit of God speaking to you or to us, as a church to act, speak, be, or change, through this word of scripture?
